Licensed certifying authority EMudhra which was started in 2008, is celebrating its achievement of crossing over 2 million eSigns today.

Explaining how the company plans to digitize companies, V Srinivasan, executive chairman of EMudhra, says, “Back in 2008, the demand for e-signs was almost absent but in the past three to four years, the demand has increased four times and this is just the beginning.”

The company has partnered with Central Government, several State Governments, IRCTC, SBI and other private banks like ICICI, Axis, and also boasts of clients like Infosys, Flipkart, Paytm.

EMudhra is currently witnessing a higher adaptability rate from sectors including BFSI, IT and e-commerce.

Esign which is an online electronic signature service can be facilitated to any Aadhaar holder to digitally sign a document within seconds.

Adding to this, Srinivasan says the technology increases the ease of doing business as well as the convenience. At present, the IT companies are primarily using the service for HR processes speeding up the process of on-boarding new employees, while e-commerce companies are using it for vendor enrollment.

Moreover with demonetisation and Modi’s Jan Dhan Yojana scheme, Srinivasan believes that it is the right time to adapt the technology as it will largely help in enhancing efficiency primarily among the financial service providers.

Along with this, the company is also providing eMsigner. Using this software, one can store documents and share it among colleagues or customers. This product serves as an extended service to e-sign and helps organizations in digitizing an entire workflow, making the process entirely paperless.

Additionally, the software also stores as well records and shows the logs and allows users to read and put e-sign. The company claims that the SaaS-based software which is given on a yearly subscription basis of Rs 10,000, is being keenly adapted by the SMEs and Government departments when compared to the IT companies.
